EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

To: KRB-YRBDC Members

From: Scott D. Pelath, Executive Director

Date: April 25, 2023

We have endured a lot of precipitation since our last meeting. Over the previous ninety days, rain throughout the watershed has been at least 25-percent higher than normal. In some areas, it was nearly double the usual expected amount. Conditions this year have realigned some of our typical work schedules.

Finance Report

Balances. As the of the date of this report, we have a cash balance of \$575,135 in our General Fund and \$1,154,119 in our assessment account. Since the last meeting, we have already paid some contracted claims and incurred others.

State Budget. The House and Senate both have passed an additional \$27,000 in annual administrative funds for the Commission. These dollars are intended to replace loss in revenue from the Thayer Farm, an upcoming loss of NIPSCO gage reimbursements, and future uncertainties about our Porter County farm lease. The problem is that both houses must agree on a budget and pass it one more time, and that is the hurdle it failed to clear last time. We will see. I have learned repeatedly that it is a fool's errand to predict the legislature.

Assessment Revenue. We are still at least two months away from 2023 distributions of assessment revenue.

Yellow River Project, Phase II

We received one construction bid from the Stanger Group for Phase II of the Yellow River bank reconstruction. Ross St. Clair at Stantec recommended that we accept the bid. As directed at the previous Commission meeting, the Executive Committee met, reviewed the engineer's recommendation, and awarded the contract to the Stanger Group. To further formalize the process, the Attorney General's office suggested that the Commission ratify the Executive Committee's action, so that it why the matter is on the agenda.

The Commission divided Phase II into two, non-contiguous project sites at 500 East and 1100 East in Starke County. The Stanger Group expects to begin work at 500 East during the first week of June.

Yellow River Project, Phase III

The Technical Advisory Committee deferred its recommendation of the Phase III sites to Marshall County Member Craig Cultice and Starke County Member Bill Crase. For Marshall County, the two urged the Vermillion property between 12th and 13th Roads and in Starke County, a section beginning immediately upstream of IN-23 and joining the Commission's Yellow River Pilot Project terminating. Territorial Engineering is already doing some survey work in anticipation of the phase moving forward.

Kankakee Logjam Management

Kevin Misch cleared logs and learners from two miles of Newton County banks downstream of IN-55. The Lake County side is mostly residential, so we have another open section. Kevin also cleaned out the Norfolk Southern bridge at Schneider for the third time since November, and it already needs to be done again. U.S. Sen. Braun's office has presented to Norfolk Southern our request to remove the bridge's wooden understructure.

Delta III is contracted to clear in the vicinity of US 421, but the river was just too high until recently. Access there is extremely problematic and soggy, so we agreed with the primary property owner that waiting was the right thing to do.

Mike Klemp of K&L Excavating has completed work downstream of US 231 in Porter County. We had similar problems with conditions there, but they were able to cut a few of the leaners before bat roosting season and can take care of the rest in safety. It looks great.

I have been in tentative discussions for the amphibious excavator to begin working downstream of US 41. Amphibious assets are the only feasible tool for most of that section.

I finally was able to access the Norfolk Southern Bridge upstream of the Dehaan Ditch, and it is hard to avoid calling it the worst bridge on the Kankakee. We spent close to \$20,000 clearing it last year, and it again is congested. Wilcher Excavating is making plans to clear the bridge, but this time in concert with the railroad. Fortunately, Brian Wunderink just burned last year's logs to make room for the new ones.

Yellow River Logjam Management

After finishing up between Range Road and Knox, Hill Excavating did eight days of log clearing upstream of IN-39. They also cleared some monster logjams up in Marshall County, where Mint City was able to do a weekend of logjam clearing there as well.

Thayer Farm

When Shelby hit minor flood stage late this winter, I told DNR that I prayed their modeling was right. It was. The property started taking water just below Minor Flood Stage and filled up with plenty of capacity to spare. The spillway worked as intended, and one could finally witness the flow between the Thayer Farm and the adjacent Blackberry Marsh, where the water falls as the river falls.

Kankakee FWA Hydrological Study

Immediately prior to the issuance of this report, a kickoff meeting with major stakeholders was scheduled for May 4 from 12:00-4:00 CDT. I know many are eager to suggest possible changes to the FWA's physical configuration.

Jasper County FEMA Project Augmentation

Vince and I met with the engineers to start moving the ball forward. Before anything else, we need to request an SEA 368 meeting with the relevant regulatory agencies. That will entail some very preliminary design work, so the regulators understand the scope and intent.

Sediment Traps

All permits are issued for the sediment trap immediately downstream of the Robbins Ditch on the Kankakee River and upstream of IN-39 on the Yellow River. We also experienced a productive and cooperative SEA 368 meeting regarding the trap upstream of the Little Kankakee.

Right now, the only limiting factors to permitted work are water conditions, contractor schedules, and property owner timeline requests. Right now, it looks like trap maintenance by the Robbins will begin mid-May.

Aukiki Wetland Conservation Area

We received one bid for spillway construction at the Aukiki WCA, and I am going to recommend that the Commission reject it and re-bid the work later. The quote is substantially too high for our budget, and the material costs are unreasonable.

I would like to complete the project this year, but it is no catastrophe if we cannot do it within our cost parameters. The engineer and I discussed some ways to further control material costs and simplify aspects of the design.

Hydroseeding

Hill Excavating just reseeded the 45-foot sand bank at the Phase I project area in Marshall County. Will all the investment we have made, we want to do everything we can to ensure an optimal result.

Invasive Species Control

We intended to begin spraying bush honeysuckle at select locations in May and June.

Formal Flood Response Plan

We had over sixty people at our flood response plan kickoff with the Corps of Engineers in Valparaiso. The more tedious sub-tasks have now commenced.

Dear Senator Braun:

On behalf of the Kankakee River Basin and Yellow River Basin Commission ("the Commission"), I respectfully request your assistance with Norfolk Southern's bridge immediately upstream of U.S. 41 over the Kankakee River. The Commission unanimously voted on January 27 to seek your intercession in this matter.

Under Indiana Code 14-13-9, the Commission mitigates flooding for eight Northwest Indiana counties within the Kankakee River Basin. A key facet of the Commission's forty-year work plan entails a reduction in unnecessary, manmade barriers to the natural flow of water.

The railroad bridge between Schneider and Sumava Resorts, Indiana, is one such barrier. Its antiquated structure continually spawns logjams, and it is a substantial expense for the Commission to regularly remove large, woody debris from its understructure. The bridge's antiquated and closely spaced wooden supports are the primary culprit in this dynamic [see ATTACHMENT 1].

There is no offsetting value to the nation's economy. The bridge performs absolutely no transportation function, and no reasonable person would assert that it could in the future. The rail line has deteriorated beyond the point of salvageability, with the local woods completely subsuming the tracks themselves [see ATTACHMENT 2].

While the eventual removal of the bridge is optimal, until then the Commission seeks Norfolk Southern's permission to remove the archaic wooden supports at the northern and southern ends of the bridge. In return, the Commission offers to fully fund the supports' removal and disposal.

Removal of the wooden understructure is in the interests of the hundreds of thousands of Hoosiers we serve. I further suggest that as a direct stakeholder in the same communities, it is in the interests of Norfolk Southern as well. The bridge serves no one, and we ought to reduce its impact on our shared customers, infrastructure, and economic assets.

At its March 8, 2023, meeting, the Technical Advisory Committee deferred to us its recommendation of the Yellow River Bank Reconstruction, Phase III, sites.

In consultation with the Executive Director and our technical advisor, Ross St. Clair of Stantec, we recommend the following Phase III project locations:


- In Marshall County, the Vermillion property between 12th and 13th Roads (approximately 0.5 miles); and
- In Starke County, a section beginning immediately upstream of IN-23 and joining the Commission's Yellow River Pilot Project terminating at IN-8 (approximately 1.5 miles including completed pilot project).

We also considered the "horseshoe bend" in Marshall County upstream of the completed Phase I project. While a project at that location would be of high value to the Commission, we believe the established property owner partnership at the Vermillion property is a determining factor.

We thank the Commission for its thorough review of this recommendation and hope for its favorable consideration. With timely approval, we hope for project construction to begin in 2024.

Dear Scott,

Lake County Parks & Recreation Department manages the approximate 2,000-acre Grand Kankakee Marsh County Park in Eagle Creek Township, Cedar Creek Township, Newton County, and adjacent southwest Porter County. This county park provides recreational and educational opportunities to the public including school groups, historical events, picnics, equestrian uses, hunting, fishing, and two boat launches on the Kankakee River. It also, stores large amounts of storm water and floodwaters for the Kankakee Watershed while providing habitat for much of the biodiversity found along the river.

Our department was approached by the Range Line Presbyterian Church and asked if we were interested in acquiring a 7.38-acre parcel owned by them and the site of the former Range Line Conservation Club. This parcel is surrounded on three sides by Grand Kankakee Marsh County Park and has been in our Open Space Vision Plan for over 30 years. The property is split between upland oak forest and forested wetland, and in the future will be protected to provide wildlife habitat, flood control, and public hunting opportunities.

The Lake Heritage Parks Foundation had this parcel appraised for \$75,000, and the church has approved the sale in this amount. We are submitting an application on May 1 to the Indiana Department of Natural Resources — President Benjamin Harrison Conservation Trust in the amount of \$30,000, and is being the supported by the Fish & Wildlife Division within IDNR. The Lake Heritage Parks Foundation is supporting the acquisition in the amount of \$15,000. We respectfully request project support from the Kankakee River Basin and Yellow River Basin Development Commission for \$30,000.
