## **OLD BUSINESS**

## **Jasper County FEMA project extension**

Mr. Pelath reported that Burke Engineering has sent all project permit applications to the relevant regulatory agencies.

## Formal flood response plan development

Mr. Pelath reported that the Technical Advisory Committee hosted a stakeholder workshop to ask for input on various plan elements.

## Kankakee FWA hydraulic study update

Burke Engineering's study and modeling is nearing completion. Preliminary evidence suggests that height adjustments to an internal levee and the Kankakee spillway may be advisable for both flood mitigation on the Kankakee River and waterfowl habitat.

## Abandoned Norfolk Southern bridge at Schneider

Norfolk Southern has granted tentative approval for the Commission to remove the section of the bridge most susceptible to logiam accumulation.

## Logjam management report

Mr. Pelath reported on logiam management work that continued until both rivers iced over.

## **Sediment traps**

A trap on the Yellow River and one upstream of the Little Kankakee are permitted and awaiting work by the selected contractor, who is suffering a string of equipment delays.

## Property access adjacent to River's Edge Farm

Mr. Pelath said the Attorney General's office is further refining a draft agreement that may resolve the access issues related to the Commission's Porter County farm.

## **Emergency Islands**

Mr. Pelath said he intended to ask the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend an emergent island for removal through a pilot project.

## **Barges**

Mr. Pelath expressed his dissatisfaction with the current barge market.

## **Current river conditions**

Mr. Pelath included an update on current river conditions in his PowerPoint presentation [ATTACHMENT 2].

## Yellow River Reconstruction Phase III bid oversight and construction

Ross St. Clair, now of SWCA, reported on the status of the Phase III project and current plans to select a contractor through formal, competitive bidding.

## **State Line Bridge relocation planning**

Mr. Pelath reiterated that the adopted budget set aside funds for technical assistance for removing the bridge.

## U.S. Geological Survey monitoring

USGS has offered to research and monitor sediment reductions related to the Commission's Yellow River reconstruction projects. The agency is also willing to subsidize the monitoring costs.

Mr. Pelath requested approval for a proposed contract with USGS that describes the research and monitoring activities, the costs to the Commission, and subsidy contributions to the work [ATTACHMENT 3].

## **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

To: KRB-YRBDC Members

Date: January 17, 2024

Since this is the beginning of another calendar year, this report will be heavy on the finance report and 2024 budget. I like this time of year. It's when we get to envision possibilities for the months ahead.

## **Finance Report**

**Balances.** We began CY2024 with a dedicated fund balance of \$1,783,498.32 and a general fund balance of \$566,503.74. The former figure includes the entirety of the December assessment revenue distribution.

**Revenue.** Overall, the 2023 assessment revenue was down 1.7% from 2022. That is a decrease of approximately \$48,000. *However*, most of this change is attributable to 1) normal annual fluctuations and 2) an inordinate number of railroad property delinquencies in Marshall County related to their new software system. Already, overdue payments are arriving, and I expect the number to close by July. I met with our team over there, I am fully confident that numbers will restabilize after the transition period. They do an excellent job.

For perspective, we also must note that assessment revenues are *up* 7.7% from the startup year of 2021. I also intentionally underestimated our 2023 revenue, so we were almost right on the mark with the budget.

**CY2024 budget.** I consulted directly with the Executive Committee while developing this draft 2024 budget. The entire budget document follows a summary of its highlights below:

- 1) I build flexibility into the capital budget in case there either is an emergency or a near-term opportunity to remove the State Line Bridge.
- 2) It is infeasible to complete both Phase III sections of the Yellow River reconstruction next year, so we have budgeted to complete the smaller, Marshall County section. Funds are set aside to initiative construction on the Starke County portion, although the lion's share would carry over to 2025.
- 3) Flexibility with the Yellow River project frees up a \$700,000 allocation for the Jasper County FEMA project extension. This amount includes \$250,000 for the project that rolls over from 2023.
- 4) The budget contains an increase for technical services, but for sound reasons. The first item is a \$75,000 set aside to engineer the State Line Bridge removal. Another \$75,000 serves as a placeholder to update the Newton County bank reconstruction and wetland mitigation plans originated under the KRBC. Funds are also available to finish the Kankakee FWA study and begin specific water control structure redesigns and permits.

- 5) \$100,000 is included for a pilot project to remove an island on the Yellow River, and \$50,000 to repair a key water control structure at the confluence of the Dehaan Ditch and Kankakee River.
- 6) We discussed acquiring barges to support in-channel projects, but my initial cost estimates were low within the current market. There is a \$100,000 set aside, but there will not be any knee-jerk purchases. There is no reason to rush and overpay.
- 7) The amounts for channel maintenance, logiam management, and sediment traps are higher than the initial 2023 budget and comparable to the amounts we expended after supplementing the budget in July.
- 8) The General Fund budget is lower than 2023 because we funded our last capital project from the original \$2.3 million from the state. A three-percent COLA is for my salary is included after consultation with the Executive Committee. The annual health insurance premium increase is low, especially after receiving a mid-year premium refund last year.

Some dollars were restored for the Kankakee River Days educations program, which has grown in both geography and popularity. The accountant recommended we set aside \$5000 for the State Board of Accounts review currently underway. Although they requested minutes and other documents, it is unclear how much time they will allocate to us. It varies from year to year.

## Yellow River Project, Phase III

We are beginning to receive the required permits for Phase III. Ross St. Clair, who has moved from Stantec to SWCA Environmental Consultants, has been retained in his new capacity to provide bid and construction oversight. I expect bid advertisement will begin in the next several weeks.

I will recommend that the Commission continue to collaborate with Ross on the Yellow River projects. We originally selected Ross St. Clair and Cardno after formal consideration by all the members, and I believe he has met and exceed our expectations. Stantec simply bought their business, and I believe the value comes from the people and not from the corporate umbrella. I also note that Jenna Meert, who also worked on our projects, has also relocated to SWCA.

## **Jasper County FEMA Project Augmentation**

All permit applications were submitted, and the Section 404 thirty-day pre-filing period elapsed without incident.

## **Logjam Management**

Since the November meeting, the following logjam management work has been completed or is underway:

- 1) Wiltjer Excavating removed logs between US 41 and State Line Bridge.
- 2) Delta III removed logs downstream of US 421 and were slated to begin upstream of the bridge before ice-up.

- 3) Mint City cut up fallen trees and partial logjams between Dunn's Bridge and IN-49.
- 4) Misch Excavating cleaned out 250 West in Porter County and Clay Street in Lake County.
- 5) Hill Excavating conducted logjam managements between Range Road and 100 West on the Yellow River in Starke County.
- 6) K&L Excavating removed fallen and leaning trees downstream of US 231 on the Porter County bank.

## **Kankakee FWA Hydrological Study**

The study, which began last May, has reached some tentative conclusions regarding beneficial alterations to the water control structures that divert water from the Yellow River to the Kankakee. The information is consistent with some of our own, on-the-ground observations.

## **State Line Bridge**

The State Line Bridge is going to be decoupled from Lake County's mitigation of the old Clay Street Bridge. That was a major inhibitor to the Commission's strong interest in removing the bridge. We should be pleased that we now can work on our own issue without an old issue being tied to it.

As stated in the budget summary, I am going to propose that we budget for and hire our own engineering firm to develop the removal plan and help navigate the needed approvals. I feel strongly that we need a firm that is committed to defending our flood mitigation mission.

## Old Railroad Bridge by US 41

As I reported to you this week, we have received tentative approval from Norfolk Southern to remove approximately one-third of the antiquated structure. Prior to our meeting, I expect to have submitted the requested paperwork for Right of Entry to begin work. The railroad has approved the removal plan that we developed in direct partnership with one of our contractors.

## **Yellow River Islands**

We have identified several emergent Yellow River islands which may be feasible for a pilot removal project, with the island immediate downstream of Range Road in Starke County probably being the best candidate. I anticipate we will resolve any regulatory uncertainties through the SEA 368 process.

## **USGS Monitoring of Yellow River Work**

I strongly believe it is time to begin monitoring the outcomes of our work on the Yellow River. It is the right and responsible thing to do. We should always be evaluating investments.

As Ross St. Clair's suggestion, I opened a discussion with USGS to monitor changes in sediment loads related to our work. Not only are they a reputable third party, but they are able to subsidize the costs of such research.

One lengthy discussion we had was whether to study sediment immediate around the project area or to take a broader look at sediment changes in the watershed. We both ultimately agreed that we needed to first take the narrower view before taking a broader view in another two to three years. We first want to ensure the projects are doing what our eyes tell us. Then we can begin to identify changes in the basin.

I will have a draft agreement with USGS ready for the meeting.

## **New River Gauge in Bremen**

The Yellow River gauge height data at First Road in Marshall County is now available on the National Weather Service website at <a href="https://water.weather.gov/ahps2/index.php?wfo=iwx">https://water.weather.gov/ahps2/index.php?wfo=iwx</a>. I remain grateful for the coordination between NWS and our private gauge vendor, OTT HydroMet.

## **Sediment Traps**

Not everything goes according to plan or our preferred time schedules, and maintenance of the sediment traps on the Yellow River upstream of IN-39 and the Kankakee River upstream of the Little Kankakee are two examples. The reasons for the delays aren't interesting – equipment breakdowns, crane logistics, weather, ice etc. However, I still expect work to begin in January.

## **Formal Flood Response Plan**

## **Property Access at River's Edge Farm**

The Attorney General's office has drafted a document that I believe may serve the interests of both the Commission and our neighbor at the River's Edge Farm, the Deardorff Family. I believe some technical details still require clarification, but I am hopeful that we have a way to address the concerns of both parties.

## Access Clearing Downstream of US 231 in Porter County

K&L Excavating in Kouts has cleared the access path from the Haberlin property downstream of US 231 through the Lake County Parks property to the Lake-Porter County Line. As usual, Mike Klemp did an outstanding job.

## **Barges**

I am not enthused about any of the price quotes I have received for used barges. Specifically, I have asked about a 10'x40' vessel and two 8'x20' sections. I think it's better to exhibit some patience in the purchasing process. Barge dealers do not strike me as eager or highly motivated to move their wares off the lot, which inspires some reasonable caution on my part.

## **Dignitaries**





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
